

#### ZOOM COFFEE MORNINGS




Every Sunday morning at 11:00am we meet for a video call coffee morning with the church family. Here is some feedback:

## JIM'S PUZZLE CORNER

### Shifty Coins:



There are four coins, 50p, 2p, 20p and 5p which are in a pile at point A, with the largest at the bottom. The object of the exercise is to move the coins from point A to point C via the intermediate point - B. Only one coin can be moved at a time and a larger coin cannot be placed atop a smaller coin.

### <u>Question:</u> What is the minimum number of moves required to re-assemble the coin pile at point C?

Hint: you might try it with two /three coins first to develop a method. If you're mathematically inclined you might be able to formulate an equation to relate the number of coins to the number of moves.

#### LAST MONTH'S ANSWERS: "The Rubik Cubic"

THREE sides [corner cubes] = Eight ONE side [centre face cubes] = Six TWO sides [centre edge cubes] = Twelve ZERO sides = [cube centre] = One
