LAST MONTH'S ANSWERS: "Arfur's Bath"

The hot water tap fills the bath in 20 min or 1/20 in one minute.

The cold water tap fills the bath in 15 mins or 1/15 in one min.

So if both taps are turned on then 1/20 + 1/15 = 7/60 of bath volume in one min.

-----> So 60/7 = 8 min 34 sec.

With the plug pulled the bath will fill in: 7/60 - 1/10 = 1/60 in one minute so bath fills = $\frac{60 \text{ mins.}}{100 \text{ mins.}}$
